CACHE and Arabian Child are have introduced a Quality Improvement Program for Early Years Settings developed for the Middle East, called Jawda™.

Jawda™ - which means 'quality' in Arabic - helps childcare settings improve the quality of care and education provided to children and their families in the Gulf region, and it helps families make informed decisions about childcare services. Jawda™ enables childcare practitioners to raise standards in early childhood settings beyond minimum licensing requirements and achieve high levels of performance as compared to international benchmarks.

Jawda[™] is a context-specific, outcomes-based system that incorporates global best practices in quality childcare and integrates it with the uniqueness of the local culture and the current context of early learning development in the region. By choosing to participate in Jawda[™], you are demonstrating a commitment to quality care and learning for young children.

Childcare settings receive a tier level certification indicating the level of quality that they have achieved in specific standards in the following domains: Child Learning and Development, Child Protection, Health and Safety, Workforce Qualifications & Professional Development, Citizenship, Community Partnership and Family Relations, Indoor and Outdoor Environments, and Leadership, Management and Administration.

The tiered system (tier 1 to tier 5) is a viable accountability measure that supports childcare centres in improving the quality of their service. Each tier builds on the foundation of the previous one, resulting in significant quality improvements at each stage. The system validates childcare centres for ongoing efforts to achieve higher standards of quality.

Miss Christine O'Connor, Nursery Director at the House of Colours Nursery (which received the highest quality rating – tier 5), commented: "As a Nursery Teacher and Director who has been working in the Middle East for the past 26 years, I am very passionate about the care, safety and teaching of very young children. Over the past years I have observed the large rise in the number of new nurseries that have opened and the vast range in the quality of staff that have been employed to care for the children who are our most valuable assets for the future. Taking







part in the JawdaTM Quality Improvement Program gave me the opportunity to assess the House of Colours Nursery, involving the whole staff team, and allowed me to observe how far we had come since our opening date 8 years ago and what we had achieved together. It also showed what are our gaps were, and we have now prepared appropriate action plans to work towards continual improvement."
